	Cllr. Toms presented an alternative plan to the approved French drains on the Moors Recreation to help alleviate the standing water issue in the Autumn / Winter. Suggested creating a scrape pond which would be fenced off for safety, approx. 2 feet deep, which it was hoped would attract wildlife and collect excess standing water.

Concerns raised included: the need to provide unfettered access to fishermen for net drying purposes, loss of a large area of recreational ground, covenants relating to the use of the land, safety with the proximity to the play park and maintenance costs. 	 Proposed from the Chair and AGREED (Cllr. Wallis abstained) to object to this application for the following reasons: Scale and mass of the proposed development within the heart Porthleven and its historic harbour Destruction of historical wall, which is shown on the circa 1875 and 1906 OS maps. It is believed that the boundary wall could be the remains of historic buildings and the Town Council consider the destruction of the wall would harm the architectural character of Porthleven withing the Conservation Area. Concerns over the proposed access via Methleigh Bottoms, this is a narrow area of road and the Town Council is concerned over the safety aspect and whether this would be adequate for larger vehicles No independent Cornwall Council led public consultation conducted. The proposed development to the heart of Porthleven should be presented to the public for comment at a dedicated independent open consultation to allow all residents to fully understand the proposal and make an educated decision. Porthleven has a large elderly demographic who may not be able to access the proposed plans online and the Town Council do not feel that this has been taken into consideration. The proposed development is adjacent to a flood plain and there are concerns regarding the proposed residential accommodation Proposed residential element of the development is outside the 	Clerk
