	The Mayor noted that although the Expression Of Interest had passed the initial stage there was no guarantee that the bid for £750,000 to the National Heritage Lottery Fund (NHLF) would be successful. A number of additional factors that should also be considered including at this stage the Town Council has no agreed loan with Cornwall Council, no major confirmed donors and there will be very little reserves left from the BSI Project budget line all of which will be required as part of the matched funding for NHLF bid.	
	Another option to be given consideration is that rather than aim for a full high spec renovation, to complete an ongoing project of works. For	

instance, year one (using earmarked funds) replace roof, year 2 precept circa £20,000 to start work on replacing all windows, year 3 replace flooring in main hall etc. This option would take longer to complete but could negate the need to rent the Institute Cottage as a holiday let and the expenses including high end finish that would incur but could still generate a lesser income if rented out as either office or catering space.
